FROM THE PRESIDENT



On Sunday, October 3, we had a great turnout for our opening reception, with nearly 100 members at Riverwinds Restaurant in New Jersey. After almost two years of remote meetings, many of us were thrilled to reconnect, share news, and enjoy conversations and camaraderie. However, in my view, the highlight was the announcement of the launch of a new Hellenic

University Club scholarship.

The Veterans of Foreign Wars Eleftheria Memorial Scholarship joins the HUC portfolio through \$80,000 in donated funding from local VFW Post 6633. The bequest grants HUC administration of the funds in perpetuity. We will disburse the scholarship annually to deserving college students related to veterans of the post. Its existence at HUC will amplify awareness of the patriotism and contributions of Greek Americans who served in the United States Armed Forces. It also advances our goal to increase our overall scholarship purse to \$1 million within a year.

Post 6633 was established at the end of WWII by Greek Americans from across the Philadelphia region. Its first gathering took place on Sunday, Nov 4, 1945. It officially secured the VFW designation in April 1946 with 98 members. What I find captivating is that the first commander of the post and several members also had been members of HUC:

- That first commander, Frank Rennis, served in battles and campaigns that included Normandy and received commendations including a Bronze Star and a Presidential Unit Citation with five Battle Stars. He was discharged in April 1945 with the rank of Captain.
- Another HUC member was Nick Gianopulos, who entered the Army in June 1944 and served in North Africa, Sicily, and Normandy before his February 1946 discharge. Nick

spearheaded production of a 507-page-long book, Honor and Remembrance, which enshrines the history of Post 6633 from 1946 through 2012. Its narratives of 102 veteran stories took seven years to publish. Its completion is a testament to Nick and the dream of deceased Commander George Baxavaneos.

Another Post member, the late TV personality George Burlotos of the Greek Spirit program, joined the Navy in 1943 in the Seabee unit. He served in Okinawa and the Pacific theatre, and received the Asiatic Pacific Campaign Medal with one Bronze Star and the WWII Victory medal. He was discharged as a Petty Officer in April 1946.

Post 6633 is always first in line in the annual Greek Independence Day parade in Philadelphia. Perhaps less known is that the names of Greek American veterans are inscribed THE onto altars at Lawnview Cemetery in Jenkintown, **VETERANS OF FOREIGN** and Fernwood Cemetery in Lansdowne. At its peak, the post had 115 members; today, it has **WARS ELEFTHERIA MEMORIAL** 27. They meet at St. Demetrios Church in Upper SCHOLARSHIP JOINS THE HUC Darby under newly elected commander Nick **PORTFOLIO THROUGH** Pelis, successor to former commander Manny \$80,000 IN DONATED FUNDING Leventelis.

That these veterans established a scholarship fund years ago reflects the greatest respect for *paideia*.

HUC has a fiduciary and moral duty to preserve the legacy of veterans' personal sacrifice on the battlefield, and later this sacrifice of personal income to help students go to college.

While many worked hard to forge this transfer, **George Roebas** deserves a medal for dedication and perseverance. A longtime HUC member, George is Treasurer of post 6633. We owe him deep thanks for gathering the support that made this possible. Many other HUC members spent countless hours on this, too. At the risk of not mentioning some, I acknowledge the hard work of **Anna Hadgis**, who had several discussions with the VFW post, as well as **Zoe Tripolitis**.
